

My special thanks go out to Stephanie Price for volunteering to serve on the Board for the fifth straight year and assuming the position of Meeting Manager. My thanks also go to Jennifer Kelleher, Ann Campbell, Shirley Walker, and Dorothea Smith for continuing to serve in key positions. We still need to fill the position of First Vice President. Over the last eighteen months, the Executive Board has been reviewing the financial state of affairs of our Club. The issue, simply put, has been that Retiree Membership Subscriptions were not generating sufficient income to pay for the basic membership benefits. The short term solution was to raise the retiree dues by a small amount (\$3.00) and to increase the attendance charge for Club Luncheon events for which attendance fees are charged; however, it was realized, this is not a permanent and equitable solution. Therefore, after considering the alternatives, the Executive Board reluctantly decided to equalize the membership dues to \$20.00 for all members. This decision was based in part on the fact that we were the only Women's Club in the Big Ten that offered a graduated membership subscription structure. The Executive Board asks for your understanding and acceptance of this necessary action. The Women's Club 2003-2004 Budget and Financial Statement will be published in the November 2003 Newsletter. William Kinderman Professor of Musicology (2001) and Chair of the Musicology Division

B.A. (music and philosophy), Dickinson College, Ph.D (music), University of California at Berkeley (1980) wkinder@uiuc.edu

Dr. Kinderman's research interests center on eighteenth- to early twentieth-century music, especially Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert, and Wagner. In addition to his doctoral work at the University of California, Berkeley, he studied philosophy at the University of Vienna, piano and music theory at the Hochschule für Musik in Vienna, and music history at Yale University. His books include *Beethoven's "Diabelli" Variations* (1987), ed., *Beethoven's Compositional Process* (1991), *Beethoven* (1995), ed., *The Second Practice of Nineteenth-Century Tonality* (1996), and a three-volume study of Beethoven's sketches and creative process to appear in 2002. He has written about thirty articles and chapters for scholarly publications, including



the Journal of the American Musicology Society, 19th Century Music, Journal of Musicology, Early Music, Beethoven Forum, Chopin Studies, and Archiv für Musikwissenschaft. Kinderman's recordings of Beethoven's piano works for Hyperion Records have received critical acclaim: The Penguin Guide to Compact Discs described his CD as "the best Diabelli Variations to have appeared for ages." Alfred Brendel has called Kinderman a "very rare bird" on account of his ability to combine scholarship and performance, and according to Gramophone, "as a scholar-performer Kinderman can be said to command the field at the moment." Kinderman's CD of Beethoven's last three piano sonatas was released by Hyperion/Helios in 2002. He serves in juries of international piano competitions, and his research has been recognized through awards from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, the Killam Foundation, and the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation. Kinderman has taught at the University of Victoria and at the Hochschule der Künste, Berlin, is an associated professor at the Aula de musica in Alcalá, Spain, and serves as the editorial chair of the journal Arietta. He is editor-in-chief of the Beethoven Sketchbook Project published by the University of Illinois Press. He often holds a seminar on Wagner's works together with his wife, Dr. Katherine Syer, at the Bayreuth Festival in Germany. Kinderman organized an international conference on Beethoven and the Creative Process at the University of Illinois in May of 2003.




