Section 6. SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE This committee shall consist of the scholarship chair, assistant chair, and one member appointed by the president. The president of the Club is an ex officio member of this committee. It shall review all applications and select recipients.

Section 7. BUDGET COMMITTEE This committee shall consist of the budget chair and the current treasurer. It shall submit a budget to the Governing Board at the first Board meeting of the academic year.

Section 8. PROGRAM COMMITTEE This program committee shall consist of the first vice president and the meeting manager. It shall arrange the programs and the locations of the meetings for the Club year, and all necessary activities for the meetings.

Section 9. SPECIAL COMMITTEES The president shall appoint such special committees as are necessary. ARTICLE VII. INTEREST GROUPS

a new interest group may be formed upon authorization of the Executive Committee.
Section 2. MEMBERSHIP All members of the interest groups must be members of the Club.


> ARTICLE VIII. NEWCOMERS' GROUP

Section 1. ELIGIBILITY Club members are eligible for membership in the Newcomers
Group during their first two full years at the University or their first two years in the Club.
Section 2. DUTIES OF THE SECOND VICE PRESIDENT AS CHAIR OF THE NEWCOMERS'
GROUP The second vice president shall have such powers and perform such duties as
are consistent with the office.
3. Scholarship committee
a. The scholarship chair shall request the University representative to prepare
an announcement to interested students of the amount and number of scholarships to
be offered by the Club during the year (see Article IX).
b. The scholarship committee shall review the applications of the interested
students.
c. The scholarship chair shall liaison with the treasurer of the Club concerning
the handling of awards and submit reports to the Governing Board concerning the fiscal
handling and allocation of the scholarships.
d. The treasurer is responsible for releasing the scholarship funds.
4. Elected chairs. The membership chair and the publicity chairs shall perform such
duties as are consistent with the respective positions (see standing rules \#9 and \#10).
5. Elected assistants. The treasurer, the scholarship and membership chairs, and the
second vice president and the third vice president shall be aided by their respective
assistants in any way necessary to facilitate the function of their offices.
B. POWERS

The president of the Club shall appoint additional chairs as are necessary to facilitate
the work of the Club.
ARTICLE V. MEETINGS
Section 1. SCHEDULE The date, hour, and place of the meetings shall be determined by the Governing Board. The first general meeting in the second semester of the University calendar shall be the annual business meeting. The final general meeting in the spring semester shall be the spring luncheon.

Section 2. QUORUM The members in attendance at a meeting shall constitute a quorum provided that the number in attendance is not less than five percent of the membership.

ARTICLE VI. COMMITTEES
Section 1. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE This committee shall consist of the president, the first vice president (programs), the second vice president (newcomers), the third vice president (interest groups), the recording secretary, the corresponding secretary, and the treasurer.

Section 2. PUBLICITY COMMITTEE This committee shall consist of the two publicity
chairs and one or more members if deemed necessary to fulfil the duties of the committee.

Section 3. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE The membership/directory chair, the assistant membership/directory chair, the second vice president, and the assistant second vice president shall constitute this committee. It shall be responsible for all matters concerning eligibility of members as outlined in Article III.

Section 4. AUDITING COMMITTEE This committee shall consist of three members appointed by the president before the close of the Club year. It shall audit the accounts of the treasurer and report to the incoming board.

Ed Kieser, Chief Meteorologist, WILL-AM-FM-TV
with tours of Campbell Hall and a chance to observe TV broadcast updates at 7:00 PM and 8:00 PM


#### Abstract

WILL's Chief Meteorologist, Ed Kieser continues the station's longstanding commitment to accurate and dependable weather forecasting by preparing daily weather forecasts for radio, and more recently, for WILL-TV. AIternating between daytime radio and nighttime TV, Ed and weather producer Mike Sola present forecasts throughout the day. Ed holds the American Meteorological Society's Seal of Approval for weathercasting on both radio and television. Many people say they've learned about what to do in a tornado by listening to Ed Kieser on the radio or by attending one of his tornado safety seminars.


Ed Kieser will describe the typical broadcast day in the WILL Meteorology Center, from piecing together a forecast for WILL-AM 580 before the sun rises to preparing weather graphics for the 9:58 PM broadcast of YourWeather on WILL-TV. Ed will discuss challenges of Midwestern weather forecasting, including extreme weather such as ice storms, blizzards, and tornadoes; preparing for radio broadcasts, including Talk to Ed and Talk to Mike; and creating a television weather broadcast. Of course, your weather questions are welcome.

Parking is available on the streets around the studio, in the new parking garage on Goodwin Avenue, and in the parking lot behind Campbell Hall, with entry off of Clark Street. Please enter the building through the main door on Goodwin.

Special opportunity: A limited number of Club members and guests will be invited into the Richmond Studio's control room to watch the 7:00 PM or 8:00 PM YourWeather broadcasts. Please arrive at 6:50 to have a chance to see the first broadcast.
