Visit Mesopotamia and China on Our Bus Trip to Chicago Museums on April 15, 2004

Join our University Women's Club and the Spurlock Museum Guild for a bus trip to Chicago on April 15, 2004. We will visit two outstanding museums: The Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago and the Field Museum.



The Oriental Institute recently completed a major renovation of its Mesopotamian Gallery. This ancient land corresponds to present-day Iraq and was the site of one of the world's great civilizations. Items in this display date as far back as 4000 BC.

The exhibition at the Field Museum is titled "Splendors of China's Forbidden City: The Glorious Reign of Emperor Qinlong" and encludes over 500 artifacts from 18th century imperial China. This exhibit is a cooperative effort between the Field and the Palace Museum of Beijing, and is the largest collection of Palace Mu-

seum artifacts ever to be viewed outside the Forbidden City.

The cost for this trip is \$35 which includes the bus, entrance fees for both museums, and snacks during the bus trip.
