This scholarship will be the first dedicated undergraduate scholarship for Social Work. Mike and Susan hope to have it fully funded by next spring, with the first awardee being chosen in 2011. A meeting with the School to talk about this Scholarship has only cemented their feelings that this is absolutely the right thing to do, and the best place for their Scholarship.

- Judy Ikenberry's support for artists because of her belief that most of them struggle for many years to get established, if they ever do. And many of them will make very little money. Her strong desire to help committed (and potentially poor starving) artists with their studies really struck a chord.
- Some of our very own Make-A-Difference Award winners, such as Christina Kurowski, who despite growing up under very challenging and very poor circumstances in Chicago, wanted to go back to her neighborhood and help others as a social worker. What an inspiration!
- Other Big 10 Clubs, who have inspired Susan with their members' generosity, newsletters, directories, and presentations at Big 10 Conferences.
- Our Decades campaign, which encouraged us to give more than we normally would have.
- Reta Torrance, Susan's mother, who was always concerned for others and raised funds, even with her passing, for many charitable organizations. She was the organizing tour de force for her rural county's food bank for probably two decades or more. We wish we could be more specific, but Mom never trumpeted which cause she was working on. She never kept score. She just did it. Quietly and with dignity.
- Arlene Haney, Mike's mother, an inspiration in her own right. A generous supporter of many causes over the years, always striving to learn, always endeavoring to do better and to be fair. She endeared us to her forever when she requested no gifts for Christmas this past year. All she wanted was donations to food banks. What a lady!

These beautiful pearls have finally fallen into place. Once they were aligned with Susan's desire to do something significant, memorable, and leadershipworthy of this great Club, it became very natural to honor these influences, especially those of our mothers', with a scholarship that would live on forever.

A special shout out should go to Judy Ikenberry. It was during Susan's conversations with Judy that she first thought, "Hey! We could do that! We could help someone who probably won't earn much money!" You change lives Judy. Thanks! And an even larger thanks to Mike, who goes along with most of Susan's ideas. You're a gem.

How can we ever thank Stan and Judy Ikenberry enough? They have been extraordinary supporters of our scholarship program in every way possible this past year. Illinois was blessed, as were we, the minute Stan was hired to be the President. We had no way of knowing then what a tremendous impact Judy would have on our organization. Thank you, thank you, thank you for capping off 2008 in a most delicious, gracious way!
