

Jim McGaughey the piper piped us through to the dining room for the traditional Burns Supper meal of soup, haggis, neeps, tatties, and trifle, followed by oatcakes with cheese and coffee. Throughout the meal we had poetry recitations and songs, toasts and of course "the immortal memory" toast to Rabbie Burns. ## **Campbell Haggis Recipe (to feed 6-8)**

1 pound ground lamb
1/3 pound of toasted steel-cut oats
2 medium onions, diced
½ tsp salt
½ tsp mixed powdered herbs
suet (optional – we use Crisco and/or butter)
lots of pepper
dash of cayenne, nutmeg or any other spice you like

Mix all together, shape into a ball, and put in oven bag. Bake in 300-325° oven for approx. 2 hours.

Please note – this is NOT authentic. Real haggis is boiled in a sheep's stomach. I used ground lamb in place of lamb heart, liver, and kidneys which are in the real thing. You will need to go to Scotland to get real haggis!!
