The annual **Scholarship Awards Brunch**, one of the highlights of The Illinois Club calendar, was held on the first Saturday in March to celebrate the finalists and their families. This year's guest speaker, **Ruth Watkins**, Harry E. Preble Dean of the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences, eloquently identified many of the attributes that were displayed by the successful candidates. Eleven students, selected from over 250 applicants, inspired and awed us with their accomplishments, their passion, and their plans for the future. After the brunch, member Chuck Simpson said, "Hearing the students share their stories gave me real hope about our future. I wish every member of The Illinois Club was able to attend this event and be inspired."

Susan T. Haney Social Work Award

Winner **Hayley Bostick**, a junior from Homewood, Illinois, stood out in an exceptional field. She is the Director of Internal Philanthropy for her Alpha Phi Sorority, which raised over \$9,000 for the American Heart Association, and is a Facilitator with ACE It, facilitating critical thinking on student safety as related to drinking culture. Hayley was profoundly moved while volunteering for Childreach International USA, helping to raise over \$60,000, and assisting in the renovation of an impoverished school in Peru. These experiences have led to her goal of a future career in international social work.

Judith Life Ikenberry Fine Arts Award

Hailing from Downers Grove, Illinois, **David Huettner** is majoring in Painting/New Media. A multi-talented artist, David works in ballpoint pen, ink, pencil, charcoal, pastel, watercolor, acrylic, oil, and gold-leafing (illumination). He is also deeply involved with *Carry the Fire*, a Registered Student Organization to tackle human trafficking and sexual exploitation. David hopes to change the world through socially aware application of his extraordinary talents.

Isabelle Purnell Education Awards

Hannah Bennett, a Music Education major from Rocky River, Ohio, made an immediate impression with her bubbly enthusiasm. Winner of the John Phillip Sousa Outstanding Bandsman Award in 2010, she was eager to attend the U of I because of the reputation of the Marching Illini. In Hannah's own words, "... a passion is something that makes you burst with happiness inside, and for me, teaching music does just that."

Agricultural Leadership and Science Education major **Kiersten Kasey** from Ashmore, Illinois was elected to serve a one-year term as Secretary for the Illinois FFA upon graduating from Charleston High School. She visited 77 Illinois high schools and saw how agricultural education was making a difference in the lives of thousands of students. As a teacher she will be committed to helping students "find their niche."

Kelley Sullivan, a James Scholar from Wonder Lake, Illinois, majoring in Elementary Education, developed her passion for teaching as an older sister. A recipient of the Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange scholarship, she spent a year at a German high school as an ambassador for the US, mastering German and tutoring both English native-speakers in German, and Germans in English. All of this was great experience for her future teaching career. Last summer she raised over \$4,000 for Childreach International USA and volunteered to help build a primary school in Tanzania.

Make-A-Difference Awards

Growing up in Nigeria, **Olatoyosi** (**Grace**) **Akinrotimi** was frustrated by the lack of health care she witnessed every day. This led to her determination to come to the University of Illinois to major in Community Health, to which end her single mother made considerable sacrifice. Grace volunteers on the pediatrics floor at Carle Hospital, is a pre-calculus tutor for minority students, and also works in Housing and Dining Services. Last summer she completed a public health practicum in Gaberone, Botswana. Her passion is to see that underserved populations receive adequate health care.

As a member of AXE, the professional chemistry fraternity, **Grant Blazina** from Naperville, Illinois, (Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering) has volunteered to teach Boy Scouts their chemistry merit badge, and to participate in Orpheum Theater open houses. Through REACT Outreach he shows kids how science can be exciting, and co-ordinates the Girl Scouts program. Grant has big ambitions for the future and already has offers to work in the sustainable energy field. We know he'll be a success!

Sally Feng, who had a dream to visit Africa and ride a giraffe, is an Integrative Biology major from Chicago. Sally has worked multiple jobs, conducted research at two fish laboratories, and is a leader with Alternative Spring Break. In this role she has assisted with a Youth and Poverty program in Mississippi, and counseled victims of human trafficking in N. Carolina, as well as volunteered at Best Friends Animal Sanctuary in Utah. Sally is well on her way to becoming an outstanding wildlife biologist dedicated to conservation.

Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering major Chuqian (Sarah) Huang wants "to transform bad things into good." As a member of the Haiti Clean Stove Project she has travelled to Haiti twice. This project aims to reduce the negative impact of cooking with charcoal by introducing stoves that use bio-mass as fuel. Her ambition is to become an environmental consultant advising companies how to be socially responsible using sustainable methods.

Natasha Wilkins from Springfield, Illinois, courageously continued with a full academic load towards her Public Policy major while undergoing treatment for Hodgkin's Lymphoma. She has now completed her course of treatment and is doing well. Natasha is focused on analyzing and remedying societal inequalities. To this end she has travelled to Cape Town, South Africa to study housing inequities, and has been on a mission trip to Honduras. Natasha participates in the LIFT college access mentor program, developing life and academic skills for minority and low-income students. Next steps for Natasha include going to Nigeria for a year, followed by Teach for America, and then law school. With her drive, Natasha is bound to accomplish these goals.

Victoria (**Torie**) **Zeman** from Riverside, Illinois, is majoring in Community Health with a view to becoming an Occupational Therapist. Supporting herself through college, Torie makes the time to engage in many volunteer activities, including Best Buddies, I-LEAP and I-Promise, and at Clark-Lindsey Retirement Village assisted living facility. Torie is also a personal assistant to a semi-ambulatory student and volunteers at the annual Families of Spinal Muscular Atrophy. Without a doubt, Occupational Therapy is the perfect career choice for Torie!
