Big 10 Conference Report

The Big Ten Conference was held June 12–14, hosted by the University Women’s Club at the Ohio State University. The 2017 conference will be held at the University of Minnesota, St. Paul.

Patricia Simpson and I were royally treated during our stay in Columbus. On Friday evening, we had a reception in the President’s Skybox at Ohio Stadium, where we got to meet Brutus, the Buckeye mascot. On Saturday, we were entertained by a video describing Buckeye Bargains, a thrift shop run by the Club; by two lectures (one on climate change and one on the Amish); and by a fashion show, where UWC members modeled outfits put together from items sold by Buckeye Bargains. Each outfit represented one of the member delegations. Each delegation was also given a toy made by the UWC Toymakers interest group. I shall guard that toy carefully and turn it over to my successor with the

ceremonial gavel and the Club copy of *Roberts Rules of Order!*

After a tour of the Billy Ireland Cartoon Library & Museum—which I would urge you to visit if you find yourself at OSU—and after a lovely banquet, we learned about the career of Ruby Elzy, a poor black girl from the South whose talent impressed a professor at OSU, who got her enrolled at the University and later at Julliard. She was the original Serena in *Porgy and Bess*. We heard some radio recordings of her voice, followed by selections from *Porgy and Bess*, sung by a lovely young graduate student and David Weaver, who has written a book about Ruby Elzy.

The conference ended on Sunday morning with a business meeting, which included a summary of the survey responses that each delegation had sent in, 3-minute presentations by each delegation, and then the University of Minnesota’s video invitation to the 2017 conference.

Our one disappointment was the lack of breakout sessions where we could discuss at length the problems and issues we experience and share solutions. Based on my discussions with members of the Minnesota delegation, I would expect that their conference in 2017 would offer that opportunity. But overall, Patricia and I were proud to represent the Illinois Club at this conference

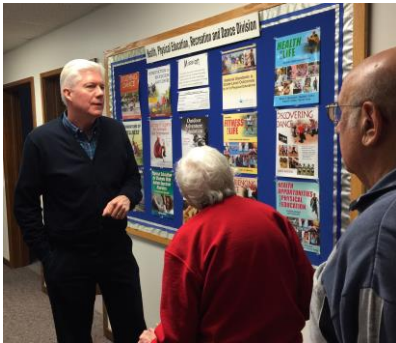

The fall tour in October will explore Rantoul, including a visit to BRG Sports, Generations of Hope, and the Chanute Air Museum. The winter tour in January will explore the possibilities of 3-D printing at the Illinois Maker Lab. The spring tour in May, co-sponsored by the Newcomers Group, will be a visit to the Japan House for a cultural tour including a traditional tea ceremony and flower arranging. Tours for 2014-2015 included a tour to a local publishing house, and a visit to the Sousa Archives and Center for American Music at the University of Illinois. Human Kinetics was started by a professor from the University of Illinois and has grown into a large publishing house specializing in sports, health, and physical fitness publications, both online and in printed form. In February we were given a very informative presentation about the company while being treated with refreshments generously provided

by Human Kinetics. We were then broken up into smaller groups and given a tour of the large facility.



Our visit to the Sousa Archives featured a presentation about a special exhibit commemorating Sousa and American music in World War I. Our interesting and very knowledgeable host was Scott Schwartz, the archivist and director of the archives. With both a lecture and a guided tour of the exhibits, we learned about the contributions Sousa and others made to the war effort. We also had the unique opportunity to listen to original recordings played on vintage equipment. Scott graciously made time for questions and answers and provided us with a lot of detailed and interesting information about that distant “War to end all wars.” The tour concluded with a side trip to Houlihan’s for a choice of World War I themed cocktails.

- **Chanute Air Museum** has a collection of aviation and aerospace artifacts with an emphasis on the history of Illinois aviation and the life of Octave Chanute.

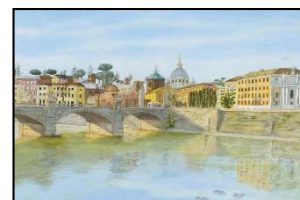
